New COVID-19 vaccine requirement

Beginning with the fall 2021 semester, the COVID-19 vaccine will be required for all Indiana University students, faculty and staff. This new requirement will allow the university to lift most restrictions on masking and physical distancing this fall. Knowing that the vast majority of our IU community is vaccinated is the only way the university can confidently return to in-person classes, more in-person events and a more typical university experience for our students, faculty and staff.

What this means for you

You should get your first dose by July 1 in order to be sure you can meet this requirement. You must [report your vaccination status](#) and be fully vaccinated by August 15 or when you return to campus after August 1, whichever is earlier.

Fully vaccinated means two weeks after the second dose of a two-dose vaccine (Pfizer, Moderna) or two weeks past the date of a one-dose vaccine (Johnson & Johnson).
